Aetna Preventive Care Guidelines

These guidelines are intended to clarify standards and expectations. They should not: Take precedence over your responsibility to provide treatment based on the member's individual needs. Substitute as orders for treatment of a member. Guarantee coverage or payment for the type or level of care proposed or provided.

Let your network doctor know that Aetna covers these preventive services 100 percent when they are billed as part of your preventive care. Aetna follows the recommendations of national medical societies about how often children, men and women need these services.

Routine Screening Aetna considers any of the following colorectal cancer screening tests medically necessary preventive services for average-risk members aged 45 years and older when these tests are recommended by their physician: Annual immunohistochemical or guaiac-based FOBT; or

For commercial members non-facility telemedicine claims must use POS 02 with the GT or 95 modifier. Fee schedules have been updated so claims with approved telemedicine CPT codes and modifiers with POS 02 will be reimbursed at the same rate as an equal office visit.
