### Anticipation Guide - Reading Rockets

Anticipation Guides (Herber, 1978) are typically a list of statements related to a topic that act as scaffolding for student understanding of the text. Students indicate if they agree or disagree with each of the statements.

One strategy teachers can use to help students document textual evidence while acknowledging multiple perspectives is the Anticipation-Reaction Guide. The Anticipation-Reaction Guide template provides an organizational structure that guides students as they read and analyze the text passage. Teachers can use this guide to:

### Guided Comprehension: Previewing Using an Anticipation Guide

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy to use pre-reading. This strategy activates students' prior knowledge about a new topic or idea. Students' interest and curiosity will be sparked when this strategy is used correctly.

### Anticipation Guide - Comprehension Strategies

Anticipatory reading guides engage learners in subskills such as prediction, making connections, and questioning (Head and Readence, 1992). The utility of anticipatory reading guides as a meta-strategy is unique in that it is particularly effective across a variety of text structures (Duffelmeyer, 1994).
