How To Play Button Accordion

To play a C major scale, push in the third button and push the bellows in, hold the same button and pull the bellows out and this will be D. Move up a button and repeat the process. Slightly half way up you will have to change the pattern. Practice the major scale playing quarter notes and eight notes. Combine the left and right hand.

A three-row button accordion adds the seventh (G) and its seventh (D7). As you begin to play the button accordion, hit the "breath" button and pull apart the bellows. Push your hands together and play two-note chords by pressing adjacent buttons or skipping buttons between notes.

The one-row button-accordion is a transposing instrument, so a player only needs to learn the fingering & notes for the C major scale. In order to play in another key, you would need another instrument tuned to that desired key.

The diatonic button-accordion (diatonic means it can only play in one key; not a chromatic instrument which can play all the sharps and flats like the piano) is a transposing instrument—like many woodwind and brass instruments, such as the clarinet, saxophone, trumpet and French horn.
