The Essence of Nursing: Knowledge and Caring

Nursing knowledge is the means by which the whole purpose of caring for patients is achieved because it underpins what we actually do. It is what defines us as nurses as opposed to similar professions such as doctors or physiotherapists, and helps to differentiate us from lay carers or care support workers.

Nursing knowledge development and clinical practice ...

Clinical nursing is a process requiring a practice-based theory of wisdom rooted in action. Understanding wisdom from a nursing context will leverage the ability of both practicing nurses and nursing informaticists as they facilitate the development and use of wisdom.

Toward an Understanding of Wisdom in Nursing

In the case of nursing, the construct goes beyond the acquisition of nursing knowledge and is defined as the active use of nursing knowledge when making decisions and judgments about many aspects of patient situations (e.g., client/patient need, health concerns, presenting symptoms, etc.; Tanner, 2006).
