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Lung Ultrasound vs Chest X-ray Study 1: Pediatric Pulmonology 2013 A study comparing lung US to CXR required that all patients undergo lung US by an expert pediatric sonographer as well as a CXR. 2 Of the 89 children diagnosed with pneumonia, lung US showed pneumonia in 88 children, whereas the CXR was positive for pneumonia in 81 children.
