While 288 of the more than 900 passengers found sanctuary in Great Britain, 620 were forced to return to mainland Europe, and close to half of those passengers sent to Belgium, France and Holland were murdered during the Holocaust.

The world's refusal of the St. Louis' desperate refugees was a death sentence for 254 refugees—approximately half of the number who had returned to the European continent in 1939.
