Pempel's (1991) volume on one-party dominance is limited to six Western democracies (Sweden, Britain, Israel, Japan, Italy, and West Germany) and a recent collection edited by Giliomee and Simkins (1999) only looks at a small number of non-Western countries (most prominently South Africa, Mexico, Taiwan, and Malaysia).
